What is formation?

Formation is often confused with leadership development. Leadership development most often focuses on knowledge, skills and competencies as well as the external environment. Leadership formation concentrates on internal dispositions, values, motivation, mission and the spiritual dimension of the person.

Formation broadens what we see. Formation programs should offer a powerful personal experience, enabling participants to gain a broader perspective or viewpoint on both their role as a Director and their personal lives, and to develop a deeper sense of personal purpose and calling.

Formation deepens what we seek. Central to the formation experience is the opportunity to reflect on the legacy of faith-based health care and the mission of the local organization. Who are we? Why do we do this work? What drives our actions? As such, formation is integral to effective mission integration.
